Video scoring was not as effective in improving the safety of patient transfers for two of the participants during the video scoring phase as it had been for the other participants and a feedback phase was added for these two participants. Finally, a withdrawal phase was implemented for six participants to determine the long-term effects of the study. The current study suggests that video scoring and feedback are effective in increasing the safe behaviors related to patient transfers and reducing the possibility of back injuries among health care workers in a skilled nursing facility.
